On Friday May 19 Tribal Veterans Service Officer Gregg Duffek held an event with Access Ability Wisconsin (AAW). This event featured an exciting new way for people to get out in the woods. AAW specializes in opportunities for those who have temporary and permanent mobility challenges. The Action Track-chair is a wheelchair with off-road capabilities. These off road wheelchairs are completely free to use and Duffek is willing to coordinate a day later in the year to have 4 of these chairs dropped off for use if any interested veterans, their families or other community members care to spend a day in the forest.. When asked about hosting the event Duffek stated "This gives an opportunity to our veterans who fought and were injured for this country a way to get active in the woods, whether it be hunting, fishing, or even just going for a tranquil ride in the woods".

Forge cont from page 7: About Forge Project

[Forge Project](#) is a Native-led initiative centered on decolonial education, Indigenous art, and supporting leaders in culture, food security, and land justice. Located on the unceded homelands of the Muh-he-con-ne-ok in Upstate New York, Forge Project works to upend political and social systems formed through generations of settler colonialism.

Launched in 2021, Forge Project serves the social

in the summer season during the hours of the Mission House Museum on Thursdays-Mondays from 10AM to 4PM through September 4th. In the fall season, the exhibit will be open on Saturdays only from September 9 to November 18th.

In conjunction with the exhibit, there will also be an in-person speaker series on five fall weekends. The presentations will feature Tribal representatives sharing on topics such as Indigenous education, traditional medicines and healing, and mapping historic sites. The exhibit and speaker series are co-sponsored by the Trustees of Reservations, Upper Housatonic Valley National Heritage Area and the Clark Art Institute. Students from Williams College assisted in the creation of exhibit and will serve as docents to visitors throughout the summer, working through the Tribe's local Tribal Historic Preservation Office in Williamstown.

Through an indoor exhibit, a garden and a traditional medicine cabinet, Our Lands, Our Home, Our Heart is a resource and connection point. It seeks to connect those living on Mohican homelands with the Tribe's local history as well as its ongoing governance, protocols and pri-

and cultural landscape of shared communities through a funded fellowship program, public education and events, a lending art collection focused on living Indigenous artists, and a teaching farm developed in partnership with Sky High Farm.

Candice Hopkins (Citizen of Carcross/Tagish First Nation) serves as Forge Project's executive director and chief curator. Forge Project was co-founded by Becky Gochman and Zach Feuer.

ities for establishing respectful relationships. President Shannon Holsey said, "The Stockbridge-Munsee Tribe is pleased to be working with the Mission House Museum to promote and educate the visitors of the Mission House on the Stockbridge-Munsee's history in the Berkshires. We hope this inspires you to learn more about the tribe and what you can do to support and protect the tribes history."

In 1734, several hundred Mohicans from New York's Upper Hudson Valley, formed the Indian Town missionary community in today's Stockbridge for the Mohicans and English settlers to co-exist and co-govern. After their forced exile by European colonists and westward migration beginning in 1783, Mohicans arrived at Oneida tribal lands in western New York, forming a community known as New Stockbridge. Moving on briefly to Indiana's White River Valley, the Tribe later settled in Wisconsin. Today, the Mohicans are known as the Stockbridge-Munsee Community, and are a federally-recognized Tribal Nation. The Museum is located at 19 Main Street in Stockbridge.
